



Testimony FROM THE MISSION

A Life Change BY WAY OF JESUS CHRIST

My name is Joshua States, and I have been in the Rescue Mission program for eight months. I wanted to take this opportunity to tell you about my life, my addiction, and how God has changed me since being at the Mission. I hope my story will encourage you today and that you will know how much I appreciate you supporting the Rescue Mission, because when you support the Mission, you are supporting my new life through Christ.

My life was completely out of control due to my years of drug addiction; I was facing death if something didn't change. I was at the end of my rope and knew that it was time to seek help. God placed the Rescue Mission in my path, and I knew



He was sending me here for a true change of heart. Because of the support of this wonderful, giving community, I was able to take full advantage of the life recovery program here, and I am clean and sober today thanks to you! Today I am clear-headed and have peace in my heart.

The day I realized my life was being controlled by my addiction was when my brother told me that the last conversation he had with our oldest brother was about how they needed to help me get my life together. They could both see that I was going to die if I continued down the path I was on. I was completely out of touch with reality and was literally on death's doorstep.

I am the youngest of 4 boys, and we were raised by our mother and father. Unfortunately, my father passed away when I was 9 years old. This drastically changed the trajectory of my life. Ten years later, my older brother was shot

Clarence's Story

"On the streets there were no good days. I was worn out. I was so tired".



Before the Rescue Mission, I was on the street. I got to where I just didn't care about myself no more, didn't care about my family no more. Seemed like one thing led to another, using drugs, stealing. I just got so tired of living like that. I just existed. I was my own worst enemy.

I had a young family and also had some other folks staying with me that I was taking care of. The money pressures were getting big all the time. Then some friends talked me into trying drugs to forget about my problems. Well, I got addicted and used for 25 years and that cost me everything. My family, my home, lots of jobs. I was homeless and alone. I moved from city to city, finding shelter and food wherever I could.

"I don't believe God ever left me. I left Him".

I finally asked my daughters for help. I sure didn't deserve their help after the all I'd done, but they started looking for me a place to go and that's how I got to the Rescue Mission. The Mission is all about love, God's love. They gave me a safe place where I could look at the things that led me to live this way. I walked with the Lord when I was young and now, at the Mission, I found my way back to him.

If I do things my way, it's probably never going to work out for me. The Rescue Mission reminded me that my meaning in life is to love and serve God. God's healing me. He has healed my relationship with my girls and I'm getting to know my grandkids too.

and killed. I could never understand why my dad was taken from me. I desperately needed him and wanted him to be in my life.

My drug use started when I was 11 years old after my father passed away. This was such a traumatic time in my life, and I was searching for anything to numb my pain. Marijuana did just that, and I began using it regularly. Later in my teenage years, marijuana wasn't enough, and I found myself trying other drugs. I felt empty, alone, and was in a place of utter darkness. My mother did her very best in raising 4 boys. She worked multiple jobs, and I was often left to be cared for by my brothers. They were dealing with their own pain and had no clue how to care for me in the way I needed. I used drugs as my escape from everything. Isolation became another form of escape for me. I would withdraw, bottle everything inside, and never express myself to anyone around me. Isolation and drug use became a very dark place for me to hide, and I did this for many, many years.

Since being in the Mission program, I have learned so much about myself. I've learned that I never really grieved my father's death nor my older brother's death. I have deep emotions from my childhood and am just now dealing with the losses in my life. I struggle with understanding my feelings, because I masked them for so long. God is teaching me that He is in control over all my feelings of failure, hopelessness, and my deep desire to be loved. He is the answer! I have also realized that I have been without a true relationship with Christ and that I have been missing out on the love He has for me. His love has truly helped me overcome and given me the peace I have longed for my entire life. His love is perfect and is exactly what I've needed all my life.

I plan to graduate from the program in January and pray God will bless me with a family of my own. I would love the opportunity to be the father I never had by teaching my children things that I had to learn on my own. I desire to share my love with others, and I am excited about the possibility of a family!
