

Testimony FROM THE MISSION

Jesus Christ Saves!

Before the life change I experienced here at the Rescue Mission, I was a victim of my circumstances. I lived a life where it felt like no one wanted me. I was bouncing from house to house, and everywhere I stayed, I felt as if I was just a big inconvenience. My own mother acted as if I was the biggest mental case ever. I'm not saying she did not love me, but again, I was an inconvenience to her. I felt she did not want me around.



My life started on October 25, 1990, in Americus, Georgia; this is the day I was born. I did not have a perfect childhood growing up. For the better part of my childhood, I lived with my grandparents in Elko, Georgia. I was a very active kid always playing in sports, but baseball was where I excelled. I was 11 years old when I first tried drugs. I began smoking and drinking with my older brother, and he would say, "I just want to make it to where you don't want to do this stuff". Along with drinking and smoking marijuana, I would huff aerosol sprays. At the age of 16, I started taking pills, because I wanted to have more fun and be accepted by those that I chose to surround myself with. When I was 17, after my brother was released from prison, he introduced me to the lifestyle of not only doing drugs but selling them as well. I eventually started doing meth after learning that my mom had an affair with my best friend. All the unhealthy relationships I chose to put myself in had a big hand in my drug usage as well. I was with this one girl. She had a child that I absolutely adored, however when we split up, she refused to let me see the child anymore. Although that relationship was purely about sex, never did I imagine I could care for a little child like I did that girl and when her mom refused to let me see her after the split, I experienced a hurt that I was not used to.

I met Alexis at my job. I was a meat cutter, and she was a cashier at the Piggly Wiggly in Unadilla. She is my best friend and the love of my life. This was one of

the first healthy relationships I think I have ever had. I hid my meth usage from her for as long as I could, but eventually, she found out. Her finding out was not as bad as I thought it would be. She told me to end it, or she would leave me. She did not stick to what she said, and eventually, she wound up trying meth too. I was able to stop for a few months, and during my clean time, she became pregnant. Alexis miscarried the baby. With that and the passing of my grandma all on the same day, I went right back down that dark path. There was a lot of fighting between us about numerous things but having to deal with the loss of not only one child but two children due to miscarriage, put more on us as a couple than I ever want to feel again. That and having family telling us everything we were doing was wrong and how we needed to live, made us feel worthless and unaccepted. Even through all that, Alexis and I have stayed together. God blessed us with two precious little girls. He also put a son in my path that was from her previous relationship. I am truly blessed to have them in my life.

It was not until my failed suicide attempt, that I realized my need for help. Not being successful in that was a clear sign that something had to give. I was broken, bitter, and stubborn. I could not ask for help until now. A miracle was needed. Looking for peace from my past was causing me to surround myself with unhealthy relationships, people who I sought approval from by using drugs with them. This had to change. Before, my life revolved around drugs and unhealthy relationships that were hindering me from being the best father I could be. Now, I let my life revolve around the One who saved me and changed my life, Jesus Christ. Coming to the Mission has been one of the best decisions of my life. With that being said, it has not always been easy, and I have had a hiccup or two since being here. All in all, the biggest challenge coming here is being separated from my girls that God has blessed me with. My two little girls, Kayleigh (5) and Ramona (2), and Gabriel (7) are the light of my world and are why I am finally stepping out against my addiction. They are my motivation. Being separated from them has felt like torture, but in the end, the torture was worth it to become the father they need in their lives.

The Mission has taught me what it means to be passionate. My biggest passion is getting lost in His word, seeking after the One who saved my soul, telling people He is real, and He does, in fact, save. Being here has taught me that I can love myself because of who I am in Christ. I can smile and truly be happy without drugs in my life. I have also learned I have a helping heart and want to help those
