Testimony FROM THE MISSION

Clean & Sober

Hello! I am Gwen Dorminey, and I was born in May of 1971 to Bonnie and Warren. We lived in Darien, Georgia until I was eight years old. That was the year my dad was transferred to Waycross, Georgia for his job. I started third grade at Waresboro Elementary and graduated from Ware County High School. Growing up in the country, I was a tomboy through and through. If I wasn't playing in the dirt and climbing trees with my male cousins, we were hunting and fishing with our



dads. I couldn't see it then, but I can look back now and see that I was already seeking validation from the male figures in my life. I married the "boy next door" shortly after graduating high school. That relationship, as so many after it, didn't last long.

My drinking began when I was 20. Freshly divorced and having never been a part of the bar scene, I jumped in with both feet. Since I couldn't drink at the bar yet, my of-age roommate came up with the perfect plan. I would be toasted when we arrived, then drink water all night and she would be buzzed by the time we left. I hear others talk about alcohol "speaking" to them or making them feel a certain way from their first drink, but I don't remember this happening with me. However, from the beginning, I drank to get drunk. I never comprehended "social drinking."

Ironically enough, a few months after turning 21, my drinking all but stopped for several years. Then I got involved in a relationship which included hanging out with his friends and family every weekend and my drinking started again. It continued to increase at an alarming rate. Before that relationship ended, I

IT'S Possible

When attempting to figure out what to share with you, I had many thoughts swimming around my head. To be honest, I know that in June we get to celebrate Father's Day, but my thought was, I've already written about that. However, I have since had to say goodbye to my father. So I would like to take this opportunity to celebrate my father. I will start by saying,



growing up, I had so much hatred for my dad due to his alcoholism and the chaos that it introduced into our lives. I lived with this deep-seated resentment until I reached my thirties. Looking back, even through my hatred, God, in His great goodness, allowed my dad to be an example to me as he began his journey through recovery. My dad's journey began on February 22, 2008. It was his example that lead me to see that change was indeed possible as I began my own journey through recovery in January of 2009. Our path to recovery looked different in the beginning, but as we both remained committed to the process, God began to do something amazing. In His grace, He allowed two wounded individuals to walk together, heal together, and build together something that neither one of us ever had together...a relationship. What a beautifully clumsy process it was and often very painful and frustrating. Through recovery, I got to experience something I longed for many years, a daddy.

At 33 years of age, that journey began. Through the hard and rocky road of recovery, my dad and I got to experience God's sweetest gift, forgiveness. It was through this that I learned the realities of forgiveness were at times very difficult due to extreme pains of the past. However, through Christ, the ability to forgive is indeed possible. Depending on the circumstances, forgiving someone can be a grueling process. It's not about simply reciting the correct words. It's about allowing God to step foot into some extremely vulnerable areas of our life and at times our past, and then allowing Him to direct us towards very difficult conversations with those whose actions have affected us. Although my father had his part to play, there was a part that I played as well, and I needed to confess those things to him also. There are so many in the world, that have experienced much pain and deep wounds from their fathers. For any hope of healing, forgiveness must take place. The redemptive work of Christ Jesus in our hearts is key, restoration and reconciliation is a definite possibility regardless of when you begin or how much time has passed. Recovery allowed my father and me the opportunity to do this hard work, and Christ gave us the strength to endure the messiness of the process. It was through Recovery that Christ allowed me to experience my dad, and my dad got to experience his son. But more than that, we became friends and brothers in Christ.

I love you Pops. Thank you for being a champion for recovery; your example lead to breaking the cycle. You are missed, but I will see you again. Because of Christ, I know this to be true. Happy Father's Day!



was having several drinks every single day just to "cope" and was told I "had a problem". Me??!! No way! I turned 30 just before this relationship ended.

Although I basically stayed single, there were friends with benefits over the next several years... still trying to feel validated, valued, and worthy. I was still drinking every day quite heavily... still wanting to numb the negative feelings and self-beliefs inside.

In my late 30's, I met my second victim... I mean, husband, and moved to the Chicago-land area. I spent four years in that relationship and the drinking continued daily. Somehow, I managed to complete a Certified Veterinary Technician program, graduated with honors the day before my 40th birthday, and was the speaker at our graduation ceremony.

A few months after graduation, I reluctantly admitted I had a problem with alcohol. Within the next year I participated in four separate rehab programs, progressing in length from a 10-day out-patient to a 28-day in-patient. Nothing seemed to work. Although my drinking did not, my marriage ended. I moved back to South Georgia and had many bouts of short-lived sobriety followed by longer and more intense bouts of drinking.

My next in-patient program was six years later and three months long. Unfortunately, I was back to drinking again after only a month. Six months after that I totaled my truck and got my first drinking-and-driving-related tickets... 20 years after I first started drinking and driving. I was told more than once through the years I was a "functioning alcoholic" and the judge even said I was the "most highly functioning alcoholic" she had ever encountered. That's not the kind of compliment you go fishing for.

From the moment I was handed those tickets in July 2019, my path to the Mission began. I finally arrived here in May 2020 after continuing the struggle with trying to stay sober and continuing to fail. I attended meetings, tried sponsors, even changed churches, but the bottle kept pulling me back in... and ever further down into the black hole I could not seem to stop digging. When presented with the opportunity of another program or a year in jail, I had never even heard of the Rescue Mission of Middle Georgia, but I knew something had to change. I wasn't far from being six feet under and although my actions and choices during my "drinking career" haven't always respected my family and my upbringing, I knew my parents didn't deserve to bury their only daughter.

I was ready for a change, I thought. Little did I realize just how broken I really was... and how painful it can be while the changes and healing take place. The staff here is so truly amazing. I treasure each of them and count them as sisters and brothers in Christ as well as dear friends. They've loved me where I was and have been right beside me through this thing we call life. We have laughed and cried, teased, and chastised, all while we all learn how to be more like Christ every single day.



I've been at the Mission for a year now, and I am looking forward to graduating this coming July. I still have a lot to learn, and I know God's work with me will never be done. That is a comforting thought to me because if He's still working on me, I shouldn't give up either.
